Historical '08 Election Nearly 'in the books'

After what may be considered one of the busiest elections ever, there is still work to do before the books can be closed on this election cycle. Most counties will have convened their canvassing boards and released official results by today. However in some counties, provisional ballots are still being verified and official results will not likely be released until next week. With so much focus on this year's presidential race, many first time voters and registered voters who have not made a trip to the polls in recent years turned out this election day. Based on news reports from around the state, it appears many election offices saw an increase in not only voter turnout, but also in the number of provisional ballots that need verified. The Secretary of State's webpage reports a statewide voter turnout of 68%. That's up considerably from the 53% turnout in the 2006 General Election.

County Boards

According to the unofficial results, of the 170 county board positions on the ballot, only 104 are returning incumbents. Thirty-four of the 66 new board members will fill vacated offices and 32 incoming commissioners or supervisors defeated incumbents in the primary or general election. In January, Hamilton and Otoe counties will begin the process of adding new board members, since voters passed expanding from a three to five member board.

Townships

Buffalo and Fillmore County voters chose to keep their townships, while Phelps County voters overwhelmingly voted to discontinue their townships. Harlan County voters will decide whether or not they want to continue the township form of government in 2010.

Jail Bond Issues

The \$15,230,000 jail bond issue was passed by a large margin in Lincoln County, while Nemaha and Seward county voters were against using local funds to update their current facilities.

State Senators

The effect of term limits for state senators will be evident when Legislature convenes in January with 16 new senators. Of the 49 legislative seats in the state, 26 were on the ballot. Ten incumbent senators were re-elected and will rejoin the 23 senators that were elected in 2006. Of those, only 12 have held office more than two years. Results for the candidates for legislative races in Lincoln's Districts 21 and 27 are so close that they will not be determined until the provisional ballots are processed.
